The Catholic University of America is collecting all possible information regarding the service of its students in the present war. This information is collected and kept at the Rector's office.

The University is doing its best to make the record complete, accurate and useful.

It will be grateful for information about any Catholic University man in the national service of America or any of America's allies. The form on the other side of this sheet may be used for noting such services. The Rector of the University will gladly send additional blank forms to all persons who may be so good as to tell him of their readiness to send facts about more than one of our students.

An important purpose of this war record is to enable the University to follow up its own men and help them wherever it can do so. Every honor or distinction won by one of our students should be on this record. Will anybody who contributes to it send supplementary information as occasion may arise? A note about a change of station, a promotion, a mention in dispatches, or a casualty, will help make the record serviceable.

The Catholic University is a member of the American University Union in Europe. Our men in foreign service are eligible to the privileges of the Union, which maintains in Paris a headquarters for American University men at the Royal Palace Hotel, 8 Rue de Richelieu and Place du Théâtre Français. Here are such arrangements as one would find in a university club in the United States. The Union has a branch office in London at 16 Pall Mall East, S. W. 1 (near Cockspur Street and Haymarket, S. W.).
